Why do research?


Research or creative scholarship are components of a rounded, balanced education. Consider these benefits:

- 3. Email! Ask your favorite researchers to talk about their work and the possibility of getting involved.
- 4. Register for a research course. ICRU offers courses for 0-4 credit hours.
